

Support **HB933/SB974** for a Strong **988 Helpline** in Maryland



HB933/SB974 WILL CREATE A NEEDED PERMANENT FUNDING SOURCE FOR 988

- Maryland's 988 helplines face a fiscal cliff when appropriations run out next year. Our state must establish a dedicated revenue source to address this cliff and prevent all future funding cliffs.
- HB933/SB974 would create a 988 telecom fee modeled after the 911 telecom fee to ensure the 988 system has the resources needed to provide support to all Marylanders who need it, 24/7 and free of charge.
- The bill's proposed \$0.25/month 988 telecom fee would generate \$15–20 million to hire staff, invest in technology, augment training, and further integrate other crisis services into 988.
- Eight other states have already created a 988 telecom fee, including Virginia and Delaware.
